2. Committee Meetings held during 2024/25

Activities of the Standing committees and Subcommittees during the year under review

(i) Standing Committee on Student Welfare

a. Annual Studentship Programme for the year 2024

The AAUP continued to provide financial assistance to needy students from all 9 faculties through its annual studentship programme. From January to December 2024, 111 students from nine faculties received Rs. 5000 per month per student through studentships from overseas chapters and personal donors.

c. Award of Scholarships at the AGM

d. Counselling Service to Support Students with Mental Health Issues

The Counselling and Psychological Support Unit (CaPSU), established at the Health Centre of the University of Peradeniya is progressing well. The Canberra and the Victoria Chapters in Australia sponsored two counsellors for the year 2024 (Rs. 48000 per month per counsellor). (ii) Standing Committee on University Development

Renovation of the Greenroom of the Sarachchandra Open-Air Theatre

The Standing Committee revised the estimated cost for the renovation of the Greenroom of the Sarachchandra Open Air Theatre. A committee was appointed to monitor the project and prepare a funds disbursement plan. At the meeting held on 18th November 2024, it was decided that the University will take over the project. The AAUP will contribute to the interior design only and to fulfill such requirements considering the requests and suggestions

(iii) Standing Committee on Finance

a. AAUP Concept Store

The AAUP Concept Store (Pera Store) progressed well in 2024 and the newly introduced souvenir items improved the sales. AAUP's merchandise partner ILTR, managed the PERA store initially. As AAUP obtained sufficient experience and exposure in managing the store, it terminated the mutual agreement on 17th October 2023. Since then, the AAUP manages the entire store. ILTR continues to remain the main supplier of most items. The AAUP also purchases high-quality products not supplied by ILTR, through other supply sources.

The PERA Trade mark was registered at NIPO and is owned by the AAUP. The PERA logo is currently in the process of being registered as a trademark, further solidifying its identity and legacy. A separate current account and a savings account has been obtained for the store.

b. Other Financial Matters

Together with the University Development Committee of the AAUP, the funds raised for renovation of the Greenroom of the Open-Air Theatre, was put to the Finance Committee. A separate audit for the Pera store has been conducted.

(iv) Standing Committee on Continuing Education and Extension Education

Planning a Teacher Training Workshop

A separate advisory committee and a working committee consists of academic members and members from the Ministry of Education complied the programme. Fundraising events were also proposed to cover the expenses of the project. After obtaining the relevant approvals, the project will be initiated.

Amendment to the article 17.2

At the 35th Annual General Meeting of AAUP, the following amendment was confirmed and added to the constitution.

‘Nomination for the post of Office-bearers of the Association shall be received by the General Secretary not less than two weeks before the relevant Annual General Meeting. For posts for which there were no nominations received on time, any member of the Association can submit nominations during such meetings.’

4. Newsletters of the AAUP

The AAUP Newsletter 2025, compiled by the editor, Prof. Deepthi Bandara is now available and is on the AAUP Website.

5. Overseas Chapter representatives at Ex-Co Meetings

After the virtual Ex-Co meetings on Zoom, the AAUP established a strong relationship with the Overseas Chapters. All the AAUP Ex-Co meetings conducted this year were held online in the virtual presence of Overseas Chapter Office bearers. Progress report of the Counseling and Psychological Support Unit (CaPSU)

Counseling and Psychological Support Unit (CaPSU) was launched in August 2022 and has since catered to the psychological needs of approximately 3500 students of the University of Peradeniya.

Counselors

The unit has 6 counselors who serve on all 7 days of the week. However as all of them work on a part time basis, they are available for counselling only at limited time slots. All 6 counselors are graduates in Psychology with additional qualifications in either a certificate course, diploma or higher degree in counseling, with at least 2 years of experience in counseling. They were selected following a stringent shortlisting procedure and then face to face interviews comprising a panel headed by the Deputy Vice Chancellor. The counselors are fluent in Sinhala and English and one is fluent in Tamil. Two of the counselors are located within the premises of the Faculty of Engineering due to the high numbers of students with psychological distress there. The others are located within the premises of the Health Centre.

Two of the counselors are paid from the financial donations made by the Canberra chapter and the Victoria Chapter of the Alumni Association of the University of Peradeniya. Three are paid by the University of Peradeniya and one works on a voluntary basis. The department of psychology is planning to recruit newly graduated students from the department of psychology to work as counsellors at the CaPSU, with an intention to have one counsellor allocated for two faculties. The Director CaPSU has made a request to AAUP to consider sponsoring one more professional counsellor to work at CaPSU. A request has also been made to the Vice Chancellor to authorise for at least one more professional counsellor.

Common psychological problems among the university students

The breakdown of the commonest psychological problems that are associated with the students are as follows:

The referral system

Once a student is referred to the CaPSU, the counselors perform an initial assessment and may either review or refer for a consultant psychiatrists opinion to TH Peradeniya. Once referred to a consultant psychiatrist, the student may be reviewed at a clinic or be admitted to the hospital for brief hospital stay, depending on the level of risk. Those students who receive admission to TH Peradeniya, on discharge may return back to their respective halls of residence, or may spend a few days or weeks at the Intermediate Care Centre (ICC) until complete recovery

Registry of high risk students

The CaPSU maintains a registry of high risk students for each faculty. The contents of this folder are shared with the Senior Student Counselor representative of each faculty, in order to ensure that regular mentoring and follow up

takes place.

The Intermediate Care Centre (ICC)

The Health Centre has a separate wing named the Intermediate Care Centre to temporarily house students with incomplete recovery. It has the capacity to keep 10-12 students at its premises, with food and lodging being supplied. Furthermore, students are able to travel for lectures and clinicals while being a resident at the ICC and a close friend or family member are also permitted to stay with the student. We are looking for donations such as musical instruments, carrom boards, other board games, book and magazines to keep the students occupied during weekends and during their free time. We are looking into organizing activities including yoga, exercises and spiritual wellbeing activities as well.

Awareness programs for staff and students

Numerous awareness programs have been conducted by experts in the fields of psychiatry and psychology targeting staff and students

- Awareness on stress, anxiety and depression -how to recognize and support those in need - Conducted at all faculties and halls of residence
- Introduction to the Counseling and Psychological Support Unit – Conducted at all orientation programs for newcomers to the faculties
- An awareness program on the CaPSU – Conducted for the representatives of the Robarasia group
- A workshop on mentoring for mentors of all faculties
- Capacity Building Workshop for Senior Student Counselors , Wardens and Sub-wardens, conducted as 3 separate workshops in collaboration with the SDC.
- Two training workshops on recognition and referring students to the CaPSU- Conducted for wardens and sub wardens
- A refresher training workshop for the counselors and the doctors attached to the CaPSU
- A seminar on common psychological problems among students- Conducted for all staff and students held on World Mental Health day

A 24 hour whatsapp line which is handled by the pre-intern at CaPSU has been functioning for the past 2 months. He forwards the whatsapp text to the oncall counsellor for the day and subsequent follow up is done by the counsellor, with referral, as necessary to the consultant psychiatrist on call for the day.

Sharing knowledge and information

The following have been circulated among the university population-including both staff and students

- A guideline for mentors and senior student counselors
- A handbook for academic staff members on psychological problems among university students (to be distributed within the next week)
- Flyers in all three languages
- An 8 minute video on common psychological problems among university students and the facilities available at the university
- 3 minute animated video clips on understanding and getting help for stress, depression and anxiety

Self assessment of mental health

An online self assessment questionnaire using the standard DASS-21 scale, which has been translated and validated for use in Sri Lanka into Sinhala and Tamil, has been circulated among students of all the faculties. The questionnaire gives instructions on assessing your levels of anxiety, stress and depression via 21 questions and gives the student the option of contacting a counselor at the CaPSU if the scores are high or gives the option of submitting the answers so that a counselor at CaPSU would contact the student and arrange counselling.

A newer screening tool, incorporating ideas extracted from the CAT screening tool , used for student mental health assessment at University of Illinois, Chicago. The new tool is being newly developed with the collaboration with the IT centre, University of Peradeniya.
